PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

At our December meeting, the BOG discussed a potential bylaw change in regards to the current expenditure limit permitted without General Membership approval. The discussion started when reviewing the proposed annual budget for acquisition of additional boats for the junior fleet. A desire was expressed to purchase single-handed boats for the Junior Training program to increase the amount of boat handling time for our intermediate level students. These boats are generally available one at a time from private individuals but, from time to time, whole fleets are put up for sale by educational institutions or other sailing clubs. It is this latter case that has prompted the BOG to recommend a bylaw change to facilitate the purchase of several boats through one transaction.

Our current bylaws specify that no Association monies in excess of \$7,500 will be authorized without approval of a 2/3 majority of the active members present at a specified General Membership meeting. While this seems to be a reasonable provision, an observation made at the BOG meeting was that when fleets of boats come up for sale, they don't stay on the market very long.

In the event that the purchase price would be greater than \$7,500, we would likely lose the opportunity to purchase the boats since it would take at lease a month to obtain General Membership approval.

PROPOSED BULAUI CHANGE

As a result, the recommendation was made to request approval of a bylaw change to raise the expenditure level requiring general membership approval to \$10,000.

Although we have been "saving up" for a large purchase if it becomes available, our annual budget includes a smaller amount suitable for a single boat purchase. In accordance with another bylaw provision, even if the General Membership approves the recommended bylaw change, the BOG will still have to approve any expenditure over the budgeted amount. This check and balance ensures that there is full agreement within the BOG prior to making such a major expenditure.

It is therefore requested that the General Membership consider and vote to approve the following bylaw change at the March Brunch:

Current: Article XIII, Section 3 - No expenditure of Association moneys in excess of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) will be authorized without the approval of a 2/3 majority of the Active members present at a specified General Membership meeting. Notice and purpose of such meeting must be sent to each Active member at least ten days prior thereto.

Proposed: Article XIII, Section 3 - No expenditure of Association moneys in excess of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) will be authorized without the approval of a 2/3 majority of the Active members present at a specified General Membership meeting. Notice and purpose of such meeting must be sent to each Active member at least ten days prior thereto.
