Slip fees are \$1.50 per foot plus electric and the lobster feast is \$35.00 per person. Slips are limited so please let me know if you will need a slip ASAP. Please provide me with boat name, loa, beam, and draft.

If you want to anchor out, \$25 per boat gives you and your crew complete access to the club including the pool. Starlight Express will be in a slip and host a BYOB cocktail hour on board.

This will be a fantastic venue for a great cruise.

The weather may be hot but there usually is a cool breeze blowing and there is always the pool to cool off in at the August picnic/cruise at Mil-Bur on Cornfield Creek in Pasadena. Come join your MRSA friends for a fun, relaxing afternoon on Saturday, August 18.

"Mid-Course" Racing Adjustments

Just a reminder on last month's emphasis on the starting line "poison" theme. In one of the late June 2012 races, the course put some of the A and B fleet boats right in the face of the Non-Spinnaker and Multi-Hull starts. To prevent this dangerous situation, most multi-fleet, rolling start, round-the-buoy racing includes language or course definitions which make the starting line "poison" – making it <u>a disqualifying offense to cross the starting line in the opposite direction on subsequent legs of the course</u>. Please keep this in mind and Sail Fast Safely out there!

received their CBYRA Certificates from Head Instructor James Dougan, and then enjoyed a delicious picnic with their families.


